

Terms

SBA's disaster loans are the primary form of Fede for the repair and rebuilding of private sector di providing up to \$2 million of financial assistance.

The \$2 million loan cap includes both physical disaster loans and EIDLs. Repayment term is determined by your ability to repay the loan.

Check disaster declarations: see if the S issued a disaster declaration in your area.
